### Ka jačanju granične sigurnosti: 73 granična službenika obučena na temu „Nadzor nad obavještajnim radom i analiza rizika“

**Mostar, 28. april 2023.godine.** – Agencija za školovanje i stručno usavršavanje kadrova (AEPTM) i Granična policija Bosne i Hercegovine (BiH) su, zajedno sa Međunarodnom organizacijom za migracije (IOM), obilježile uspješan završetak programa obuke na temu „Nadzor nad kriminalističko-obavještajnim radom i analiza rizika“ tokom zvanične ceremonije dodjele certifikata za 73 službenika agencija koje učestvuju u radu Centra za analizu rizika.

Svečanost je bila prilika da se uruče certifikati za 57 od 73 predstavnika/ce Granične policije BiH, Službe za poslove sa strancima BiH, Uprave za indirektno oporezivanje Bosne i Hercegovine, Ureda za veterinarstvo Bosne i Hercegovine i Uprave za zaštitu zdravlja bilja Bosne i Hercegovine koji/e su završili/e program obuke. Program se odvijao u tri faze prema nastavnom planu i programu koji je izradio AEPTM u skladu sa Frontex metodologijom za zajedničku integrisanu analizu rizika (CIRAM 2.0).

Ravnatelj Agencije za školovanje i stručno usavršavanje kadrova Marko Vujević je zahvalio predstavnicima Granične policije BiH, Ministarstvu vanjskih poslova Danske i Međunarodnoj organizaciji za migracije IOM na suradnji koja je rezultirala organiziranjem i provedbom kvalitetne petomjesečne obuke. *„Cilj je bio uvezati predstavnike Granične policije BiH, Službe za poslove sa strancima, Uprave za neizravno oporezivanje Bosne i Hercegovine, Ureda za veterinarstvo Bosne i Hercegovine i Uprave za zaštitu zdravlja bilja Bosne i Hercegovine da mogu, kroz protok bitnih informacija, imati nadzor i obavještajne podatke na vrijeme, te ih dostaviti kolegama koji će djelovati i praktično i preventivno“.*

Cilj obuke je bio da se omogući dalja operacionalizacija Zajedničkog centra za analizu rizika državne granice (JCRA) jačanjem sistema pravovremene razmjene informacija i institucionalizacije analize rizika. Kroz obuku, učesnici su stekli poboljšana znanja, vještine i kompetencije u vezi sa nadzorom kriminalističko-obavještajnog rada i analizom rizika prema Zajedničkom modelu integrisane analize rizika 2.0 (CIRAM 2.0).

Načelnik Središnjeg istražnog ureda Granične policije BiH, Adnan Kosovac, kazao je kako su za razvoj Granične policije iznimno značajne oblasti kriminalističko-obavještajnog modela rada (ILP) i analize rizika. Podsjetio je kako je Granična policija BiH u zadnjih desetak godina uložila značajne napore s ciljem osposobljavanja službenika. *„Jedna je stvar kad imate ljude koji rade svoje poslove, a druga je stvar kad imate trenere koji mogu dalje obučavati kadrove u našoj instituciji. Granična policija je pokazala da je otvorena za sve vidove suradnje, za unapređenje svog rada, a pogotovo nas raduje činjenica što smo se kroz ovaj model približili radu policija*

*Europske unije, pogotovo FRONTEX-ovom modelu rada u oblasti analize rizika“, naglasio je Kosovac.*

Ova obuka ima značajnu stratešku važnost jer će dovesti do usvajanja jedinstvene metodologije na svim nivoima institucija koje su uključene u Integrisano upravljanje granicama i dodatno poboljšati sigurnost granica pružanjem informacija u realnom vremenu o prekograničnim kretanjima i aktivnostima. Cilj obuke je također povećati saradnju između različitih agencija kao ključan korak ka poboljšanoj efikasnosti u suzbijanju prekograničnog kriminala, istovremeno olakšavajući usklađivanje sa evropskim i međunarodnim standardima.

Koordinator za migracije IOM-a, Dražan Rozić kazao je kako je IOM implementirao ovaj projekt uz potporu Ministarstva vanjskih poslova Kraljevine Danske, te da će nastaviti tu suradnju kroz obuku graničnih policajaca, odnosno kadeta, policijskih inspektora uz pomoć sredstava Europske unije. *„IOM je posvećen migracijama, pravima migranata, ljudskim pravima, zaštiti ranjivih kategorija migranata i samim ovim projektom nadam se da ćemo poboljšati pristup upravljanju migracijskim tokovima kroz BiH, kroz podršku i suradnju sa Službom za poslove sa strancima i Graničnom policijom BiH“, kazao je danas Rozić.*

### Towards enhanced border security: 73 borders officers trained on “Supervision over criminal intelligence work and risk analysis”

Mostar – On 28th April, the Agency for Education and Professional Training (AEPTM) and Border police of BiH together with the International Organization for Migration marked the successful completion of the training program on “Supervision over criminal intelligence work and risk analysis” for 73 officers of agencies participating in the Risk Analysis Centre during an official certification ceremony.

Bringing together the Border Police of BiH, Service for Foreigners’ Affairs, Indirect Taxation Authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bosnia and Herzegovina Veterinary Office and the Bosnia and Herzegovina Plant Health Protection Administration, the ceremony was the occasion to handover certificates to 57 out of the 73 individuals who completed the training program.

The program was conducted in three phases following the curriculum developed by AEPTM in accordance with the Frontex methodology for joint integrated risk analysis (CIRAM 2.0).

Director of the Agency for Education and Professional Development of Personnel, Marko Vujević, expressed gratitude to representatives of the Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, and the International Organization for Migration (IOM) for their cooperation, which resulted in the organization and implementation of a high-quality five-month training program. *"The aim was to connect representatives of the Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Foreigners Affairs Service, the Indirect Taxation Authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Veterinary Office of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the Plant Health Protection Administration of Bosnia and Herzegovina so that they can have timely surveillance and intelligence information flow through important information channels and provide them to colleagues who will act both practically and preventively."*

The aim of the training was to facilitate further operationalization of the Joint Centre For State Border Risk Analysis (JCRA) by strengthening the system of timely information exchange and institutionalization of risk analysis. Throughout the trainings, participants acquired improved knowledge, skills, and competencies related to the supervision of criminal intelligence work and risk analysis according to the Common Integrated Risk Analysis Model 2.0 (CIRAM 2.0).

The Head of the Central Investigation Office of the Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, Adnan Kosovac, stated that the areas of the criminal-intelligence -led policing (ILP) and risk analysis are extremely important for the development of the Border Police. He reminded that the Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina has made significant efforts in the past decade to train its officials. *"It's one thing to have people doing their jobs, and another thing to have trainers who can further train personnel in our institution. The Border Police has shown that it is open to all forms of cooperation to improve its work, and we are particularly pleased that through this model we have approached the work of police forces of the European Union, especially the FRONTEX methodology in the field of risk analysis,"* emphasized Kosovac.

The training is of significant strategic importance as it will lead to the adoption of a uniform methodology at all levels of institutions involved in Integrated Border Management and further enhance border security by providing real-time information on cross-border movements and activities. The aim of the training was also to increase cooperation between different border agencies as a crucial step towards improved efficiency in combatting cross-border crimes, while facilitating harmonization with European and international standards.

The Migration Coordinator of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) in BiH, Dražan Rozić, said that IOM implemented this project with the support of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Denmark, and that they will continue cooperation through, inter alia, the training of Border police officers, i.e., cadets, police inspectors, with

*the help of EU funds. "IOM is dedicated to migration, migrant rights, human rights, protection of vulnerable categories, and with this project, I hope we will improve access to managing migration flows through Bosnia and Herzegovina, through our cooperation with and support to the Service for Foreigners' Affairs and the Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina," Rozić said today.*

The ceremony was organized by the Agency for Education and Professional Training (AEPTM) and the International Organization for Migration, with the scope of the "Western Balkans Integrated Border Management" facility, financially supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, to mark the joints efforts throughout the successful implementation of the trainings.

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
